For 25 incredible years, the *Bright Horizons Foundation for Children*[®] has helped our **Bright Horizons**[®] family to make the world a better place by providing opportunities for them to give back to the communities where they live and work.

As an organization, Bright Horizons has always been focused on providing the highest quality education and care, and our people are uniquely driven by that mission. But we also recognize that many in our communities are faced with difficult circumstances, and we are beyond proud of how our extended family helps others to face those challenges. Our employees generously give their personal time to the service of others. Over the last 25 years our US based employees have given more than 200,000 volunteer hours – nearly a full year for every year the Foundation has been in existence.

Through our programs, the Bright Horizons Foundation for Children actively supports our employees' volunteerism and engages our broader community in activities that leverage their skills and expertise to brighten the lives of others. Our signature program – Bright Spaces – has created 450 safe, cheerful environments in family shelters, police stations and other community organizations here in the US. This particularly impactful program brings hope and comfort to more than 130,000 children per year.

From a monetary perspective, since inception, the Foundation in the US has reinvested more than \$6.5 million into our communities – most of which was creatively fundraised by our amazing Bright Horizons family.

Since 2005 the Foundation has also been operational in the UK, and our impact has reached even further, to an additional 30,000 children this year. The UK Foundation also celebrated an important milestone in 2024 – the opening of their 100th Bright Space!

There are many ways to measure impact, but no matter how it's done, it's clear that the commitment of YOU – our Bright Horizons family – is second to none. I could not be more grateful for your dedication and engagement with the work of the Bright Horizons Foundation for Children. With your help, we are confident in the Foundation's future and that together we will continue brightening lives for many more years to come.



The signature program of the Foundation, *Bright Spaces*® provide unique hubs for children to play, gather with families, and access the services they need. These spaces are created by Bright Horizons volunteers in partnership with the local agencies in which they are built.

Exhausted and overwhelmed, she needed time to speak with case managers about next steps, but her children, having been up all night due to stress, were restless and visibly anxious. We were able to take the children to our new Bright Space. The children were immediately drawn to the STEM building blocks, offering them a much-needed distraction. The calming atmosphere, complete with the beautiful tree decals on the walls, gave them a sense of safety they hadn't felt in days. Shortly after settling in, the peace of the space allowed them to fall asleep and take a much-needed nap. The Bright Space not only helped the children, but it also provided their mother with a brief respite to gather her thoughts and regain a sense of calm. It's moments like these that remind us how important it is to have such a comforting space available for families in crisis."

New Bright Spaces



Two new Bright Spaces were opened at **Family Renew Community**, in Daytona Beach, FL. Family Renew Community provides housing for families experiencing homelessness in Volusia County. More importantly, they help parents on a path toward supporting their families in places of their own. These Bright Spaces were created in honor of our colleague Joan Stapleton, DVP of Back-Up Center Operations, as part of heras part of her 2023 Jim Greenman Award of Excellence.



A new Bright Space opened at the **Capital Caring Adler Center** on the Van Metre Campus. This space will provide a comfortable and cozy spot for children and families to play, relax, and be together while visiting loved ones at the Hospice Center. This space was created in memory of Erika Turner, beloved daughter of Bright Horizons Regional Manager Kerri Turner.

Bright Space makeovers



Bright Horizons employees created a beautiful **Bright Space for the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless** headquarters in Denver. This family room will be a welcoming space for Colorado residents seeking assistance with housing and other services.



The team from **Sony Pictures Entertainment Child Development Center** in Los Angeles recently completed a major refurbishment of a Bright Space at Miriam's House, a transitional sober living program that offers comprehensive social services to low-income mothers and their children. This space will be a comfortable and fun environment for families.

Gleason Volunteer Grants



Brightening Lives Activities

Established in 2015, Brightening Lives Activity grants enable Bright Horizons employees to give back to their community with a group service project as part of a work gathering or event. These activities are easy, convenient, fun, and are intended to connect volunteers to the needs of their local community. BLA grants provide financial support to purchase materials and supplies for fundraisers and volunteering activities. .

Impact by the numbers

Bright Horizons employees dedicate **thousands** of hours each year to group volunteering activities, fundraising events, drives, etc. Brightening Lives Activities that benefit local communities include projects like mitten trees, blanket tying, toy/diaper drives, comfort kits and more.

Impact stories



In honor of the Foundation's 25th anniversary, our Operations team in Division 12 (Seattle area) hosted a diaper drive to benefit our partner Mary's Place, which serves women and families experiencing homelessness. More than 12,000 diapers were collected and donated to the agency!



The team at DoTerra Kids in Utah partnered with The Refuge Utah for a Brightening Lives Activity. Their summer camp program had no funding for snacks, specifically when going on field trips. The center team used a Brightening Lives grant to make snack packs with a card of inspiration to send with the children on their excursions.



Employee Relief Fund

Established by Bright Horizons in 2018, the Employee Relief Fund provides direct financial assistance to Bright Horizons employees recovering from personally catastrophic events beyond their control. Qualifying events include natural disasters, medical bills not covered by insurance, funeral expenses, homelessness and more.



The Foundation is proud to be part of the ERF process and to distribute much-needed emergency funds to so many Bright Horizons colleagues.

Our 25th anniversary celebrations

Walk On Across America

Throughout the summer and fall of 2024, employees of Bright Horizons child care centers and offices nationwide, along with their friends, families and community members, stepped up to support children and families in crisis, while also commemorating the 25th anniversary of the Foundation. By coming together to organize *Walk On Across America* events, these teams helped to create a sense of community, increase awareness and raise funds for the Foundation.



Starting in Seattle in June, signature Walk On events took place in more than a dozen major cities including Westminster CO, Wheaton IL, Pittsburgh PA, Salt Lake City UT, Minneapolis MN, Phoenix AZ, Jersey City NJ, New York City, Arlington VA, San Francisco CA, Tampa FL, Los Angeles CA, and Newton MA.

In total, more than **120 individual centers and offices** across the country – and more than **2,500 colleagues and friends** – participated in the campaign. We are so grateful to our amazing Bright Horizons community for coming together to celebrate this milestone for the Foundation.

Bright Horizons Golf Tournament

In 2004 a group of Bright Horizons employees from the Construction, Design, Facilities, IT and Procurement departments decided to invite a group of vendors to come together for a golf event to benefit the Foundation. And so, the annual Bright Horizons Golf Tournament was born. From that initial outing, the tournament continued to grow in both participation and funds raised year over year. Starting in 2014, a new tradition began, when the opportunity to sponsor "makeovers", or refurbishment of some of our existing Bright Spaces was offered to participants.

2024 was not only the Foundation's 25th anniversary, but also the 20th annual Golf Tournament.
